Isaiah 6:1-9a


Isaiah 6:1 In the year of King 'Uziah's death I saw *Adonai* high and exalted, seated on a throne! The hem of his robe filled the temple (LXX the house was full of his glory [*Sh'khinah*]; Targum "the glory of *Adonai*, high and lifted up in the highest heavens." 6:2 *S'rafim* stood over him, each with six wings - two for covering his face, two for covering his feet and two for flying. 6:3 They were crying out to each other, "Kadosh, Kadosh, Kadosh: Holy, Holy, Holy is *ADONAI-Tzva'ot* (LORD of Heaven's Armies)! The whole earth is filled with his glory!" 6:4 The doorposts shook at the sound of their shouting, & the house [of *Adonai*] was filled with smoke.

Isaiah 6:1-9a

6:5 Then I said, "Woe to me! I [too] am doomed! ("It's all over! I am doomed) - because I, a man with unclean lips, living among a people with unclean lips, have seen with my own eyes the King, *ADONAI-Tzva'ot* (LORD of Heaven's Armies)!" **6:6** Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal he had taken from the [bronze] altar with a pair of tongs. **6:7** He touched my mouth with it and said, "Here! This has touched your lips. Your iniquity is gone, your sin is atoned for."

6:8 Then I heard the voice of *Adonai* saying, "Whom should I send? Who will go for us?" I answered, "Hinni - I'm here, send me!" **6:9** He said, "Go and tell this people:

But when [Uzziah] had become powerful, he also became arrogant, which caused him to become corrupt. He sinned against Adonai his God by entering the sanctuary of Adonai and personally burned incense on the incense altar.

“In the year that King Uzziah died” (Isaiah 6:1)



King Uzziah, who ruled Judah in the 8th century BCE, was famous for his building projects. When he died, he could not be buried in the royal tombs, because he was a leper. Some seven hundred years after his death, in the Second Temple Period, Jerusalem expanded, and Uzziah's tomb had to be moved outside the new city limits. This Aramaic epitaph was erected to mark the king's new burial place. It reads: "Hither were brought the bones of Uzziah, King of Judah. Do not open!"

Isaiah / Yesha 'yahu ("God Is Salvation")

The Vision

Whom Did Isaiah See?

- Psa.110:1 A Psalm of David: ADONAI says to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool."
- Heb.1:3, 13 (**quotes** Psa.110:1); Heb.10:12, Yeshua sitting at right hand Adonai -
- John 12:41 Yesha'yahu said these things because he saw the *Sh'khinah* [glory] of Yeshua & spoke about him.
- Rom.8:34 **Rav Shaul informs** Yeshua died, was raised, and is at the right hand of Adonai



- **Isa.6:1b** The Hem (train) of his robe filled the temple.
- **Northern lights as if a robe. God displaying his glory**
- **John 12:41** Isaiah saw the Sh'khinah [glory] of Yeshua
- **LXX:** and the house was full of his glory / Sh'khinah

Isaiah 6:2-3



6:2 S'rafim stood over him, each with six wings - two for covering his face, two for covering his feet and two for flying. 6:3 They were crying out to each other, "Kadosh, Kadosh, Kadosh: Holy, Holy, Holy is ADONAI-Tzva'ot (LORD of Heaven's Armies)! The whole earth is filled with his glory!"

6:4 Praised so loud shook foundation doors; & Temple filled with smoke / glory cloud

- **Exod.40 Tabernacle filled with the Presence of Adonai in smoke & cloud to extent Moishe could not enter.**
- **Gen.15:17 Adonai passed as cloud between covenant pieces with Abram**
- **Exod.19, 20 Moishe encountered Adonai on Sinai & received Torah: smoke cloud**



Isaiah 6:6

6:5 Then I said, "Woe to me! I [too] am doomed! ("It's all over!") - because I, a man with unclean lips, living among a people with unclean lips, have seen with my own eyes the King, *ADONAI-Tzva'ot* (LORD of Heaven's Armies)!"
